- 6. "Spouse" represents spouse of the householder. It does not reflect all spouses in a household responses of "same-sex spouse" were edited during processing to "unmarried partner".
- 7. "Family households" consist of a householder and one or more other people related to the householder by birth, marriage or adoption. - 9. The rental vacancy rate is the proportion of the rental inventory that is vacant "for rent". It is computed by dividing the total number of vacant units "for rent" by the sum of the renter-occupied units, vacant units that are "for rent", and vacant units that have been rented but not yet occupied; and then multiplying by 100.
