



#### Net Migration for Maryland \*





### Largest Net In and Out Migration by State for 2011-2012\*







### Largest Net In and Out-Migration by State for 2012-2013 \*





## Net Migration by Age of Primary Tax Filer for Maryland, 2012 and 2013\*





