5. Current dollar data was converted to constant 1999 dollar data by using the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics' Consumer Price Index (CPI_U_RS) for 1989 and 1999. 1989 dollars x1.297861 = 1999 dollars.

6. 1999 data on median earnings are not directly comparable with 1989 data on median income. Based on Current Population Survey data for 1999, median income for full-time, year-round workers was higher than their median earnings by about 3 percent for males and by about 4 percent for females.
